Epipremnum Aureum - Epipremnum comes from the Solomon Islands, and develops very quickly, loves heat and humidity, and is also ideal for hanging plant home. Or almost perfect.

In addition to placing it in a basket on the library and let the sprouts to drag him down to earth, it can cover an entire surface and to make truly green screen. Incidentally, the plant is often used for landscaping that is large surfaces. Feels great on a cork surface, since it is easy to grasp.

Rapidly growing, involve plant, ideal for growing in indoor conditions. The leaves are heart-in two possible colors. The leaves of the "Marble Queen" are dotted in white and those of the "Golden Pothos" - yellow - green to golden. They are covered with wax, which makes the plant can tolerate adverse conditions.

But what you need to know if you have one home "pet"? He really loves the heat and humidity, which means it sure such conditions throughout the year. Keep it from direct sunlight! Species with mottled leaves should be a little more lit place full of the green counterparts.

Water regularly stayed with 24 hours water. Soil should not run dry! It is also often leaves sprayed with water. From March to October every 2 weeks to Turin with a liquid fertilizer that is added to water for irrigation.

You can make the plant more "rich" if you remove bare shoots.

Then put them in water until the root, and stick them in pots. They easily snap. A can try to plant them directly into the soil. A chance to leave. However it is spring, because then the most favorable period.

As a tropical plant needs plenty of water and moist air. Watered once - twice a week. Room temperature should not drop below 10 degrees.

Transplant as ivy.

Fueled with liquid fertilizer every month.

Opraskva regularly to provide the necessary humidity.

Requires good illumination of the room to the patterns do not disappear in the leaves, but could not live in direct sunlight.

Propagation: By cuttings.

If the plant has drained too much, spring break off the tips to start branches.
